POLITICAL NEWS

The questions raised by Peter Dowling, our State member for Redlands, were answered (very generally) by Rachel Nolan, the Minister for Transport. Peter will continue to follow this matter up.

Question on Notice - No. 197 - Asked on Wednesday, 22 April 2009

- Q1. With reference to the transport jetties at Victoria Point and Coochiemudlo Island that do not meet the minimum standards for disabled access? Will the Minister explain why this inequity has been allowed to occur and when it and when will it be resolved?
- A. I thank the Member for the question. The Bligh Government remains committed to investing in boating infrastructure across Queensland. In 2005, the Queensland Government provided \$197,800 in funding to improve safety and disability access at Victoria Point jetty. This jetty is owned and managed by the Department of Transport and Main Roads. Although the jetty at Coochiemudlo Island is owned and managed by Redland City Council, the Department of Transport and Main Roads is working with the Council to assist them to identify options for providing disabled access. The Bligh Government is investing more than \$160 Million in the capital program of the Emergency Services division of the Department of Community Safety in the 2008/09 financial year. More than \$20 Million of this investment is for major building capital works for Queensland Fire and Rescue. Three new fire stations and 11 replacement or redeveloped facilities will be commenced or completed during 2008-2009. The completion of the new \$3.2 Million Redland Bay Fire and Rescue Station is planned for the last quarter of 2009.



Neighbourhood Watch, Cleveland 17 Coochiemudlo Island. Meeting 27 May at Community Hall. 7.30pm, fourteen members attended and four apologies were received. Our Liaison Officer Constable Joseph Mohr and his partner, Constable Debra Halls, were also present. Constable Mohr advised that since the previous meeting there had been 19 formal complaints, 20 patrols and two on trail bikes. There was an increase in unregistered motor vehicles and these were to be discussed with members in the near future.

Zone A Co-ordinator Jacqui Pritchard had operated a stall at the recent markets and reported that although results were not as high as on the previous occasion, it was good to "keep the flag flying".

PROPOSAL - FORMATION OF AN RSL SUB BRANCH ON COOCHIE

Weren't the ANZAC Day Services on Coochie just great this year? Of special note, the inaugural Dawn Service was inspiring; the Australian Army and Navy cadets were superb, they were a credit to our Nation and our Island. A 'big' thank you should be passed onto all those involved with the preparation and running of these services, not forgetting the Dawn sausage sizzle and warm copper which was appreciated by all.

For the past couple of years, the idea of forming an RSL Sub Branch on Coochie has been floated. This year, Stan Harris canvassed some of the Islanders who attended our Services, which culminated in a list of about twenty two (22) ex Australian and Allied Army, Navy and Air Force servicemen and women who indicated an interest in the formation of an Island RSL sub branch.

We have (so far) found Veterans from World War 2, Korea, the Malayan Emergency, the Indonesian Confederation and Vietnam, as well as Australian Defence Force (ADF) Regulars, Reserves and National Service. Also, eligible members of the Allied Forces are also entitled to join the RSL and, you 'only' need to have served a minimum of six months as a regular or a reservist!

FIRST RESPONDERS

The Coochie First Responders (our voluntary ambulance service) recently updated and renewed their skills at the Ambulance Station in Redland Bay. The First Responders are there to give as-soon-as-possible advanced first aid while awaiting the arrival of the mainland paramedics. You'll notice that they arrive in their own cars (unless you get our Honorary Officer, Michael who gets to drive the ambulance) and have ambulance kit (uniforms and treatment aids).

The First Responders volunteer their time in and around their jobs and family commitments. We don't have First Responders on duty at all times but for a small island, we do well to have most of the week covered.

Remember that the best way to get the first responders is to call 000. Please use the ambulance service as you would if you lived on the mainland (ie: only for those conditions that require immediate and emergency care). Please see your GP or local hospital for all other issues.

Remember that our First Responders are volunteers and respect their privacy by not turning up at their front door.

FROM THE GOLF CLUB...

The club is undergoing a minor face lift with the completion of the new serving area and some external painting around the BBQ area and entrance. This has freshened the appearance and made the area a bit more welcoming. A new security system has also been added.

It was disappointing that our fundraising bush dance with the Bushland Boogies had to be postponed until Sunday, 4 October. The course was under water for seven days and all golf was cancelled. The response to ticket sales was excellent and thanks goes to all those who supported us. All money has been refunded and new tickets will be issued in September.

As most people will be aware, the club has to comply with the Redlands W.E.M.P. [water management program], a program for all non-residential organisations. We were very surprised to be one of four businesses to receive an award from the R.C.C. Water and Waste. The other three businesses were larger organisations, who had elaborate water systems and large investments. In four years, we have reduced our daily water usage from 50 kl to under 13 kl per day. FISHY BITES ...



Fishing in the Southern Bay

Climatic conditions have been playing havoc with the southern bay's normally fairly consistent lead-in to winter. Huge quantities of fresh water in the system, unpredictable winds, and some fairly significant variations in temperature, have all resulted in either delayed, fragmented, or shortened runs of our normal fish species.

Those that have managed to take advantage of the periods of calm weather (usually during the week) have often been rewarded with some interesting catches though, such as large estuary cod on the weed beds between Coochie and Victoria Point, or big cuttlefish in the deep sections towards Peel island.

Snapper, which are normally fairly abundant in small sizes towards mid summer, have only recently appeared in reasonable numbers on the northern & southern ends of Coochie, and are yet to start biting consistently over on the northern and western side of Macleay island.

The larger snapper are few and far between, and are tending to respond to bait, rather than soft plastics or lures, due to the lack of water clarity. For those willing to venture further afield, wellington point has an excellent rubble bed that is worth trying; it has been producing fairly consistent catches of plate-sized snapper in the last few weeks.

Yellow Fin pike have arrived in hoards, and it's usually a fairly simple matter to catch a few good sized fish either off the Jetty, on the western side of Macleay, on the eastern end of the weed bank south of Coochie, or on the north-west of the island. Although they have a generally poor reputation, when fresh they make an excellent meal. With few bones to worry about, are a good option for the kids. Pike are predatory fish, so try soft plastics jigged in 3m+ of water, or small minnow-lures worked fairly quickly over broken bottom.

A brief run of tiger prawns before Christmas, was followed by a run of banana prawns in January - some longer than an adult hand. Cast nets, or prawn nets, on the eastern weed beds at night at low tide seemed to produce results, though there were also reports of boat-based cast netters picking up massive feeds down at the mouth of the Logan River, and just off the Redland Bay boat ramp. Although the prawns have disappeared for the moment, the recent flush of fresh water from the rivers, may bring a run of school prawns out into the bay, so keep an eye on the front beach at night.

A fantastic season for blue swimmers is now on the wind-down as the water temperature drops, but don't throw the pots away just yet - the rains may bring a surge of muddies.

Summer/Spring was a good season for Mangrove Jack, with fish hitting fairly hard in Erapah Creek on occasions. Activity is now winding down, as the adult fish leave the estuary to go offshore. There's a chance that a lucky angler may pick one or two big jacks up around Coochie's deeper holes while they're in transit though.

The annual tailor run was a bit of a fizzer, with only a few anglers being able to find the fish in reasonable numbers as they swim through. The jetty at Victoria Point, the boats to the south of the jetty, and the channel west of Coochie seemed to produce the most fish. The south-east corner of Coochie produced reasonable numbers of fish, for those with patience.

As the black marks on the Coochie jetty show, Squid have been around in fairly significant numbers of late. Jigging from the jetty on a calm night can often produce a good feed. Other spots to try are the little rocky area on the south-east of the island, the rocky outcrop 1/3 of the way up the eastern beach, and the shallow section on the north-east of the island. Alternatively, walking the shallows with a torch and a cast-net is a good way to pick up a feed - low tide, on a calm night usually produces the best results.

Winter whiting are starting to appear in reasonable numbers. Try the sand flats near red rock, or the rocky foreshore to the east of the jetty. Yabbies are a good option, though their soft bodies tend to fall to pickers fairly quickly. Beach worms are a good option, and small slices of squid are excellent if the fish are biting hard.

The occasional school of Pelagic is also appearing around the northern end of Macleay, and also near the south-eastern channel marker near Coochie. With a little luck, the conditions may be just right to catch a few tuna or spotty mackerel between Macleay and Goat Island.

For those who'd like something different, the recent floods have pushed a large number of Tilapia over the Tingalpa dam wall - fishing up near the dam wall of Tinny creek can be an exciting process, as the fish are aggressively taking lures. Perhaps a good option for kids who would like quick results. Tilapia are a noxious pest from Africa, and you are encouraged to take as many as you can. They're also not too bad on the plate; try BBQ's Tilapia with mango chutney on a bed of rice, for something of a taste sensation.
